Civil Liberties and Rights

What exactly ARE civil liberties and rights?

- Civil _____ are the rights and freedoms GUARANTEED by the Bill of RIghts and the Constitution, and interpreted through laws passed by elected officials and decisions made by the Supreme Court.
- Civil _____ are legal rights that keep people and groups free from discrimination.

There are three important ideas to keep in mind about the liberties and rights contained in the Constitution:

Important Idea #1

Important Idea #3

Many state and local governments have laws to protect civil liberties. These laws can be more protective of liberties and rights than the U.S. Constitution, but they may not be ______ protective. This idea is known as the "constitutional _____ " because it represents the lowest possible protection. States can go higher than the floor, but not lower.

Example: while the federal laws have not specified that people who are homosexual are protected from housing and employment discrimination, many city/state governments have passed laws protecting them.
