	Cirrus clouds are made up of tiny chunks of ice. They are thin wispy clouds that sit high up in the sky.		Stratus clouds cover the sky like a gray blanket often blocking out the sun. They are usually dark grey or black.	
Clouds form when tiny drops of water and ice join together in the sky.		Cumulus clouds are white, puffy clouds that look like giant cotton balls in the sky.		Cumulonimbus clouds are dark gray. These clouds signal to us that a thunderstorm is coming!
