### What Are the Parts of a Mission?

#### Workshops

- Made goods to sell or trade using wood, metal, and cloth
- Native Americans worked in the workshops

Most missions are built along rivers to provide water for drinking, travel, and irrigation.

#### **Fields**

- Grew crops
- Raised livestock
- Tended by the Native Americans at the mission

Jose de Escandon was a Spanish colonizer who established the colony of Nuevo Santander along the Guadalupe River in 1727. He then became governor of the area and established more than 20 colonies with missions in Texas and Mexico.

#### Church

- Built to spread the Catholic religion to the indigenous population
- Led by Spanish Friars who also oversaw the everyday tasks of the mission

Presidio -Spanish for a heavily guarded military town or settlement

#### Housing

- Where the residents of the mission lived
- Protected the residents from outside attacks
- Spanish soldiers served as guards
